













Investment process

- A fundamental principle of competitive markets is that profits regress to the mean. The fund managers believe the secret to successful investing is to identify those few companies that have a durable Economic Advantage which allows them to defy this principle and sustain a higher than average level of profitability for longer than expected.
- Economic Advantage is the collection of distinctive characteristics of a company that competitors struggle to reproduce even if those competitors have understood the benefits arising from those characteristics. 











Objective and investment policy

Objective

To seek to achieve growth in capital (net of fees), ahead of inflation, as measured by the UK Retail Prices Index, over the longer term (over 5 to 7 years). Investment Policy

To invest globally in a range of asset classes including equities (company shares) and equity related securities (investments whose value is linked to the performance of the shares in one or more companies), bonds (for example, loans to either a company or government that pay interest), money market instruments (for example, short term loans that pay interest), deposits and cash and indirectly in private equity and precious metals (for example, gold). 
